

After it was played each track was briefly discussed and then scored by each member according to how much they liked it. The top five most popular on the day were as follows:

As can be seen the music played reflected a wide range of genres and personal tastes. This is in keeping with the very essence of the Music Club in that it encourages members to appreciate music that they might not otherwise have listened to.

The Club is open to all Shed Members to either bring along their own tracks to play or just to listen to the selections of others. All genres of music are welcome although selections should not last for more than 5 minutes to enable a goodly selection to be played in one session. Exerts from longer pieces can be played. We can cope with tracks on CD, internet, or memory stick although we can't play vinyl records at present.

It is hoped that the Music Club will meet on a monthly basis throughout the year – normally the first Wednesday in the month and starting as soon as possible after 10 o'clock. The next listening session will be on 6 April 22, in the back room off the Bar (the door next to the pool table). There are no additional charges other than the usual £2 Shed sub payable in the usual social room.




RSPCA

Stay safe online - Avoid being a victim:

The following is the advice of a very good friend of mine, Mr Terry Skinner. Terry is an expert in his field and has worked extensively with the Police, Armed Forces and Business as cyber securty consultant. Many of these points are so obvious but do we all follow them all, all of the time, I doubt it. A timely reminder to us all.

- Don't make yourself a target, keep a low profile, and keep information on social media about yourself to an absolute minimum, take the threats seriously and protect your Identity.
- Don't put any embarrassing information, photos, messages, or facts about yourself on any website, things that you could later come to regret, or end up looking stupid.
- Don't put the details of what you are doing, where you are going, or if you are going away from home on any social media sites.
- Don't respond to, reply, or click on anything you get sent which is suspicious. By replying you
 acknowledge that you are there, and you could get malware sent to your computer or device, for later
 attacks against you.
- Questions to ask yourself when you get <u>ANY</u> messages or emails:
 - Do you know the person or organisation who sent it?
 - o Were you expecting it?
 - o Does it look real?
 - Are there spelling mistakes or poor English?
 - o Is it asking for confidential information?
 - Unless you are sure that you can really trust it, do not open or click on any attachments or web links contained within it.
- When browsing web sites on the internet, beware of items or links that you can click-on, and <u>never</u> download anything from websites that are suspect, are new to you, or which you were not expecting.
- Ignore ALL pop-up windows or messages from the Internet saying that your computer might be infected, there is no way that anyone can tell that remotely, it is a scam.
- Make sure your anti-virus software is up to date on your computer or device and back-up your personal data regularly to a removeable disk/device.
- <u>Never</u> pay any ransom if you are attacked, seek help from an IT professional immediately and do
 report it to the police. There is little or no chance you will ever get your computer or data restored even
 if you do pay, and you will never get your money back!
- NEVER let anyone, whoever they say they have remote access to your computer, it is a scam.
- No genuine telecom, internet or software company will ever call you about security.
- Have good quality, easy to remember, but secure passwords and protect them. Use words that mean something personal to you, but are not obvious, and could never be associated with you, or your immediate family.
- As regards avoiding Scammers, the footnote is to use your common sense! Remember there is nothing
 for free, any apps that let you use free services means your personal information and your ID which
 you give them, is being sold to advertisers and mailing lists which scammers can also get hold of.
